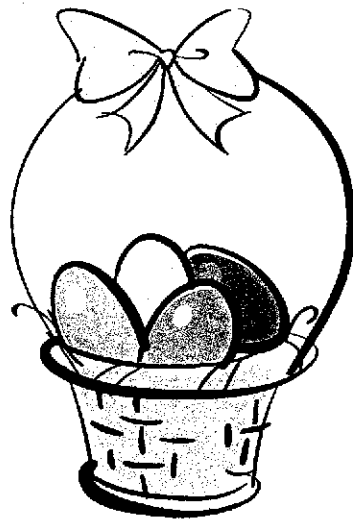

  - D. We have used several places to provide food in the past and it worked out well.

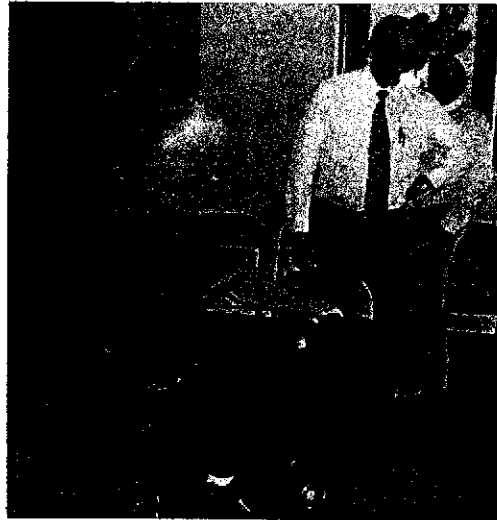

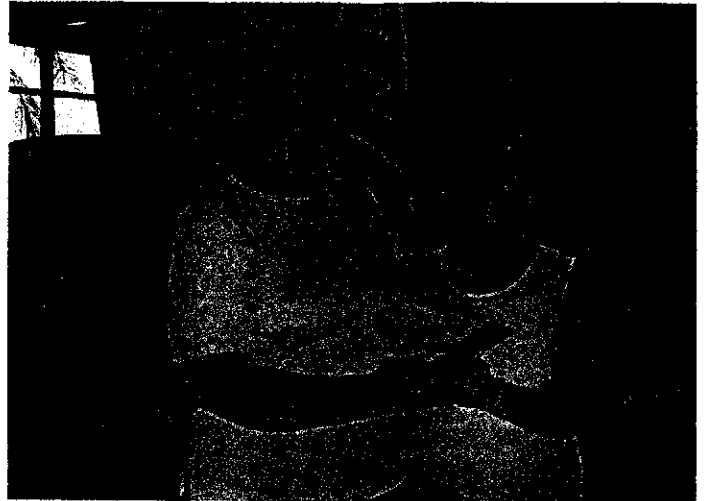

## ANOTHER CHANCE TO SEE A WONDROUS LIFT OFF



NASA has bumped the planned March 31<sup>st</sup> launch of an Atlas V rocket and military communications satellite to April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The change is due to valve problems. The 192-foot-tall Atlas and its payload, a Wideband Global SATCOM, will lift off no earlier than April 3<sup>rd</sup>. The launch window is from 8:31pm to 9:33pm.

Watch your TV news or read your local newspaper to see if there are further changes.

This night launch should be a magnificent sight. Don't miss it. It can be seen from Lost Lakes.
