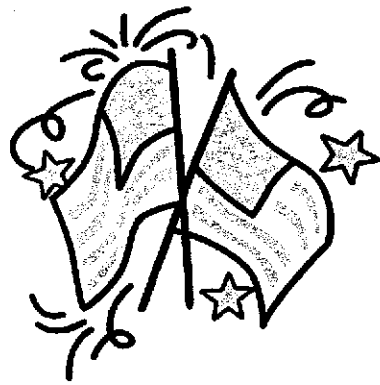

A NOTE FROM THE EDITORS

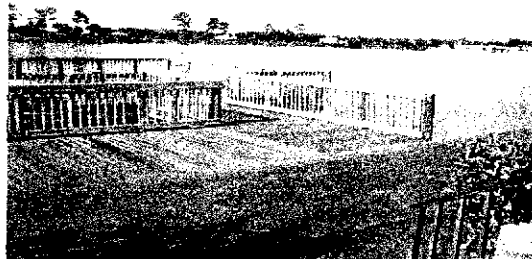

We are happy to announce that Jim married Suzanne Worland on June 6th and is now living in Merritt Island. We wish the newlyweds much happiness.

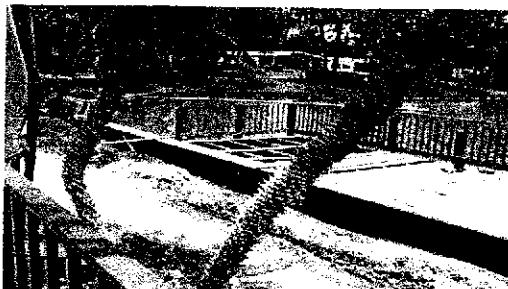

The 4th of July

This day is one of the most important holidays of our Nation. It is time to remember the 4th of July --and what it is all about.

Have you ever wondered what happened to the 56 men that signed the Declaration of Independence?

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, and were tortured before they died. Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned. Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured. Nine of the 56 fought and died from wounds or hardships of the Revolutionary War.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor.

What kind of men were they?

Twenty-four were lawyers and jurists. Eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners; men of means, well educated, but they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties, and died in rags.

Thomas Mc Kean was so hounded by the British that he was forced to move his family almost constantly. He served in the Congress without pay, and his family was kept in hiding. His possessions were taken from him and poverty was his reward.

INSPIRATIONAL MESSAGE CONTINUED

Vandals or soldiers looted the properties of Dillery, Hall, Clymer, Walton, Gwinnett, Heyward, Rutledge, and Middleton.

At the battle of Yorktown, Thomas Nelson, Jr., noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. He quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed and Nelson died bankrupt.

Francis Lewis had his home and properties destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife, and she died within a few months.

John Hart was driven from his wife's bedside as she was dying. Their 13 children fled for their lives. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find his wife dead and his children vanished.

Some of us still take these liberties for granted. Take a few minutes while enjoying this 4th of July holiday and silently thank these 56 patriots. It's not too much to ask for the price they paid.

We know what the price of freedom costs---And our service persons all over the world are paying that price. It's time to get the word out that patriotism is NOT a sin, and the Fourth of July has more to it than beer, picnics, and baseball games.

CHINCH BUG INFESTATION IN LOST LAKES

Massey Services has detected extensive chinch bug infestation in many yards especially in Northwest Lakes. This infestation was discovered while treatment was being made for the residents who reported individual problems with their lawns as detailed in last month's Newsletter. Massey immediately began treating the yards which were detected during that treatment. On Monday, June 22 the regular fertilization and insect control which is scheduled every other month was started and was to be completed on Friday, June 26th. In addition to the regular treatment all lawns were to be checked for chinch bug infestation and treated individually if infestation was found.

Homeowners should closely monitor their lawns and make sure their sprinklers are working as they should be in order that the treatments are properly absorbed into the lawns. The damaged area(s) may actually appear to get worse before recovery takes place. This delayed recovery is due to turf areas already fed upon by the chinch bug that have not yet shown injury. Recovery should begin within a few weeks of treatment.

In some cases however, homeowners may need to re-sod damaged areas to speed recovery and to prevent uncontrollable weeds from invading.

MASSEY SERVICES (Continued)

If areas are determined to be in need of re-sodding, it should be noted that the damaged area(s) cannot just be covered up with new sod but will need to have the old sod removed prior to re-sodding the damaged area(s). We will have additional information should this be needed.

Your representatives request that should you have a problem with your lawn that you fill out a form (located on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse) and that you not contact Massey Services directly so that we may have a handle on any problems that arise in the Lost Lakes Community with regard to your lawns. If you have any questions about your lawns or you are unable to go to the Clubhouse to complete the form, please feel free to contact your representative as listed below.

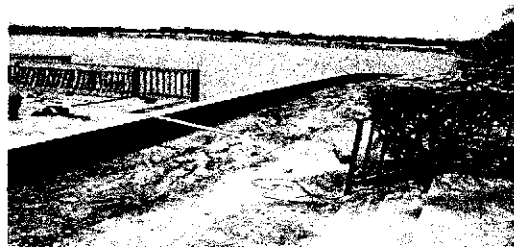
