SILENT WITNESS

As many of you know, the Silent Witness of Florida, a domestic violence homicide awareness program has been growing within the confines of Lost Lakes as well as throughout the state of Florida. The generous support of the Crafters who knit shawls to warm family members who have lost loved ones through domestic violence homicide has been extended into 2006 for the Silent Witness presentation in October. Many residents have also generously donated clothing and household goods to Serene Harbor, a Brevard County domestic violence shelter. A new opportunity to volunteer in the arena of domestic violence is through a Court Watch program which the Silent Witness program will establish during the summer. Volunteers will be trained to observe court proceedings involving domestic violence. They will gather information to identify gaps in service or trends in prosecution and sentencing for cases of domestic violence. The following is from and part of the Northwest Declaration of Condominium. Particularly Chapter 14
Which covers the rules pertaining to making any changes or additions to your property.

1. The rules stated here are not in order, but they are still the rules.

14. RESTRICTIONS ON USE AND OCCUPANCY. The use and occupancy of the Condominium is subject to the provisions of this Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation of the Association, its and any rules and regulations hereafter established by the Condominium Association, and all applicable ordinances and laws of local, state and federal government. The said restrictions include, but are not limited to, the following:

14.1 Violations of Use Restrictions. Violations should be reported to the Board of Directors in writing to the attention of the President of the Association. Violations will be called to the attention of the violating person by the President or the Board of Directors. Disagreements concerning violations may be presented to a hearing panel appointed by the Board, which will take appropriate action. Such action may include the imposition of a fine for each violation.

14.9. Landscaping. The cost and implementation of the landscaping of the Unit (with the exception of the initial landscaping that may be done by the Developer) is expressly assumed by the Owner. All plans for landscaping, lawn ornaments, structures, and other alterations must be approved in writing by the Board prior to installation. Each approved alteration must be completed within thirty (30) days of such approval or approval shall be deemed revoked.

14.10. Site Maintenance. In order to protect the mutual investments of residents of the Condominium Owners and residents shall maintain the exterior of their mobile home and other approved enclosures and the Unit in a clean, attractive and a well-kept fashion. Residents shall comply with the following:

B. If an owner or resident plans to do any digging on the Unit, the Board must be contacted first so that placement of utility lines and pipes may be determined. If any such utility line or pipe is damaged by an owner or resident, his agent or contractor, it shall be repaired immediately at the owner's expense. If the Association must repair such damage because of the owner's failure to do so immediately, the owner of the site shall be responsible for the cost of repairs and shall pay the full sum incurred by the Association plus a twenty (20%) percent overhead charge upon billing with the next regular assessment, which may be collected by judgment.

G. Unsightly items including, but not limited to, upholstered furniture, ironing boards, brooms, mops, freezers, refrigerators, washing machines, tires, ladders, picnic coolers, toys, recreational equipment, basketball hoops or stands, etc., are not permitted to remain outside the mobile home or other approved enclosures.

Please take the time to look at your copy. There are many other rules which Owners need to know
